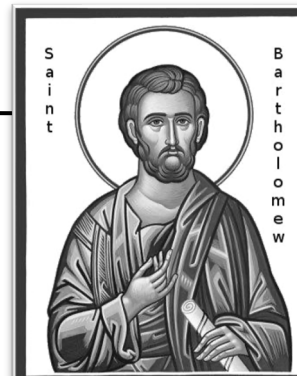
### CRIMINALISATION OF PRAYER IN SCOTLAND
