

SEASON of EASTER

EASTER is more than just the most important celebration on the liturgical calendar. The resurrection of Jesus is the foundation of all Christianity.

Referencing Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, the Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches that

"If Christ has not been raised.

then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain."

The Resurrection above all constitutes the confirmation of all Christ's works and teachings."

This is why we rejoice. Easter is everything. Jesus's death frees us from sin and his resurrection ensures new life for us.

Jesus overcoming death is the reason we know His name today. It's the foundation of all Christianity. With His death and resurrection, Jesus opened heaven to all of us.

Because of Easter, we know that no matter what sufferings we experience or what sins we struggle with, God is always with us.

The Season of Easter lasts for 50 days culminating with the feast of Pentecost, where Scripture (Acts 2:1–31) tells us that the Holy Spirit descended on the Apostles.
