



We are still celebrating the great feast of the Resurrection and for 50 days we are in the liturgical season of Easter.

We are just like the disciples who often do not recognize the Risen Lord when He appears to us each day – just like on The Road to Emmaus. From today's Gospel of Luke :

"Now while he was with them at the table, he took the bread and said the blessing; then he broke it and handed

And their eyes were opened and they recognised him; but he had vanished from their sight."



Now they finally recognise Jesus and they recognise him in the action of breaking bread. It was an action they had no doubt seen him take many times. It was an action they had seen him take when he fed the crowd of thousands—over and over, breaking those five loaves of bread and somehow the pieces fed the crowd with baskets and baskets left to spare. That action embodied Jesus ministry: feeding the hungry.

That action embodied his sacrifice as he told his friends in the Upper Room: this is my body broken for you. Cleopas hadn't been there, but the other disciples had, no doubt, told them about that last supper as they all tried to sort out what had happened. That action of breaking bread embodied the goodness of God in Jesus as he, the shepherd, fed his lambs.
