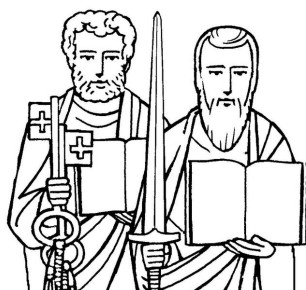
Just a wee reminder that our tearoom is open after the 11am mass today. All welcome to come to the parish hall for a cuppa and a catchup.

He can work through each of us, no matter our shortcomings.

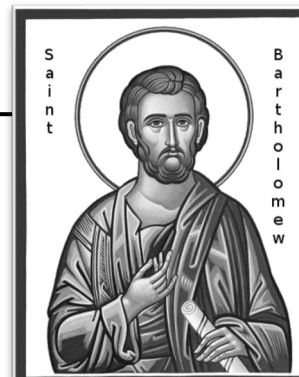

MESSAGE FROM SOCIETY FOR THE PROTECTION OF UNBORN CHILDREN (SPUC)

This General Election could be crucial in the fight to protect the sanctity of human life.

The threat of abortion being decriminalised was narrowly averted in the last Parliament, when the calling of the General Election put an end to the Criminal Justice Bill, and, with it, the extreme abortion amendments. But whoever wins the election, these proposals are sure to return. We are also expecting a big push to legalise assisted suicide during the coming session of Parliament.

These are key issues for Catholics to consider when deciding who to vote for. SPUC is running an election campaign encouraging people to use their vote to protect the most vulnerable. In an exciting new initiative, **we have launched an online platform that allows people to contact candidates in their constituency** and ask them these two questions:

QUESTION 1: Would you vote to support or oppose decriminalising abortion, i.e., legalising abortion on demand and up to birth?

QUESTION 2: Would you vote to support or oppose any move to legalise assisted suicide?
