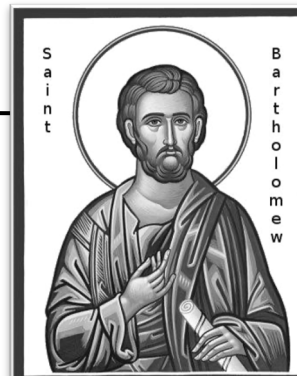

**ASSISTED DYING : WHAT DOES IT ALL MEAN?** Saturdays 10<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup> and 24<sup>th</sup> June 2023 at 2pm in ST ALOYSIUS' CHURCH, Garnethill, Ogilvie Centre 25, Rose Street, G3 6RE

Liam McArthur MSP is proposing a bill to legalise assisted dying. This will undermine the right to life and put vulnerable people at risk of coming under pressure to end their lives prematurely.

A series of Holyrood Webinars on Assisted Dying, Euthanasia and Palliative Care will be shown featuring Professor Marie Fallon, University of Edinburgh, Dr Miro Griffiths , University of Leeds, Dr. Leonie Herx, Queens University, Kingston, Canada and Tanni Grey Thompson, television presenter and former wheelchair racer.

Discussion will follow and Gordon McDonald, CEO of Care not Killing will be in attendance. All are welcome.

**IF YOU ARE ADMITTED TO HOSPITAL.** Please note for your information:

In accordance with confidentiality-rights (GDPR) the priest is not routinely notified when a person is admitted to hospital unless a specific request is made by the patient or a member of their family. This is due to a person's right to privacy which is a human right.

Below is a **Declaration** people can cut out and keep for the day when they may be admitted to hospital.

**PATIENT'S RELIGIOUS DECLARATION**

I am a Roman Catholic.

While a patient in hospital, I wish to exercise my Human Right, as enshrined in the European Convention on Human Rights (Article 9~1), of practising my religion.

I request that the Roman Catholic Chaplain be informed of my admission to hospital, and that I receive a visit from the Roman Catholic Chaplain.

I give explicit consent for this information to be made available to the Roman Catholic Chaplain and I would request that this document form part of my personal case notes. (insert your name)
