

ROOM FOR REFUGEES

This is some details about a refugee who is in need of assistance.

Jurgita is 44 years old. She is from Lithuania and has been living in the UK for 14 years. After Brexit she applied for status on the EU settlement scheme but was refused, so now she has no access to legal work, benefits or homelessness assistance. She was a live in carer for an elderly man in Wishaw but when he died in September last year she was locked out of the house and lost most of her belongings, including her passport. She went into homeless accommodation but was evicted in early June this year because she hadn't been able to pay the rent of £80 per night.

The Room for Refugees group have been hosting her through their Room for Refugees project, but now have no available hosts. She needs a place to stay while her immigration advisers help her submit a new EU Settlement Scheme application. Her first hosts have offered to host her again towards the end of August when they come back from their holiday.

She does not smoke, drink or use drugs and has no health conditions we are aware of, although her homelessness and the grief of losing her friend and home so quickly still affect her.

She is Catholic and has been going to mass wherever she has stayed. If you can help in any way, please speak to Fr. lan.
