ASN MASS

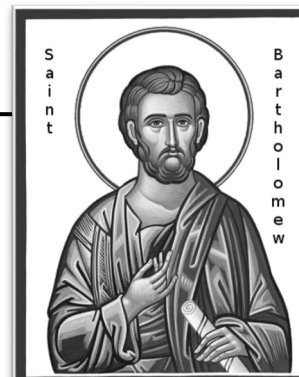

A parish project has been discussed and approved by our Parish Pastoral Council and in the next week or 2, and at long last, painting of our church will begin. The work will be undertaken in stages, with the Sanctuary Area being Phase 1 of the project. This phase will be completed by end of June.

Phase 2 of the project, painting of the main church area, will not begin until after the school holidays.

This is wonderful news as next year is the 70th anniversary of our parish, our Platinum Jubilee! Way back in 1955, our parish here in St. Bartholomew's began. As you sit in the church today :
